IDEA OF SCIENCE4FUN PROJECT

The Science4Fun project aims to find an attractive and effective way to teach science. By developing resources that are easy to understand and use, the project partners seek to present natural sciences such as physics, biology, chemistry, geology, environment and astronomy in an interesting way to allow students to discover and develop their STEM skills.



The project tries to overcome the reluctance of young people, especially young girls, to pursue an educational and professional path in the sciences. The tools developed during the project will equip the teachers with tools that will help them increase student motivation and show them that science can be fun and understandable.

RESULTS SO FAR:

- Despite the difficult times we all face, the partners are in the process of achieving the set goals according to the project plan:
- Pilot tests were carried out in Slovenia, the Czech Republic, Spain and the Netherlands during the summer holidays and autumn period. Other partner countries will start their pilot tests in January 2021. The second test round will take place in March / April 2021 and the final round will take place in July 2021.
- All 5 Moodle courses for teachers are translated into all partner languages. Polish partner has developed its own courses.
- All partners have completed their own educational resources such as video lessons, lesson plans, and interactive resources. These resources have been translated and are now available in the languages of the partners.
- Partners have collected and uploaded existing material to the Science4Fun Repository.
- The handbook and guidelines will be ready by the end of January 2021.
- The Project website has been updated and translated into all partner languages.
